Aptos evolved from an Indian village to a Mexican cattle rancho, Claus Spreckels’ thoroughbred horse ranch (the millionaire sugar grower), a lumber town, an apple processing center, and ultimately a resort. The first public airplane flights took place here and it was the 1989 Loma Prieta earthquake epicenter.

7 Rodgers House

The Rodgers House, built in the 1870’s by James Rodgers, now beautifies the front entrance to your Santa Cruz County Fair and serves as national landmark on Highway 152 East of Watsonville and West of Gilroy. The house contains archives chronicling the house’s history, including stories of the Rodgers Family and the history of the Pajaro Valley. Several notable family photographs show John Steinbeck, the brother of Esther Rodgers, including one carving the family Thanksgiving turkey.

This unique little museum’s exhibit chronicles over 100 years of local surfing history beginning when 3

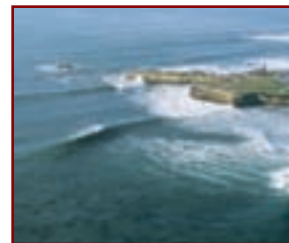

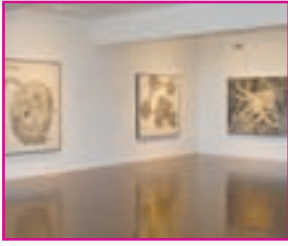
